### Dear Iowa High School Guidance Counselor,

Annually, the First Friday Breakfast Club, based in Des Moines, awards scholarships to graduating Iowa high school seniors committed to reducing homophobia and increasing awareness and tolerance of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) issues in their schools and communities. Awards will be made in the amount of \$3,000 per student. Due to the incredible generosity of our donors, this past year we were able to present 16 scholarships for \$3,000 each!

Scholarship recipients represent a cross section of students from all Iowa high schools, from urban and rural districts and both public and private schools. These students are leaders in academics, athletics, drama, and art. Each has committed their time and talents to helping others to understand and to appreciate the diversity and contributions their LGBTQ+ friends bring to their schools and communities. There are no restrictions in the selection procedure based upon

### FFBC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Application Due Date: March 15, 2025

The **First Friday Breakfast Club** (FFBC) is an educational group for LGBTQ+ persons and their allies. Monthly meetings provide members and guests an opportunity for education on community affairs from local, state, and national opinion leaders and provide them with positive images of the LGBTQ+ community.

As a part of its educational program, FFBC awards \$3,000 scholarships to Iowa high school seniors who have demonstrated leadership in efforts to increase education and understanding of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBTQ+) issues and to reduce homophobia in their schools and/or communities.

An applicant must plan to pursue post-secondary education. Scholarships are awarded without regard to gender, race, religion, creed, marital or employment status, or gender/sexual orientation of the prospective recipient or their relatives. Additionally, there is no restriction on the type or location of the educational institution where post-secondary education is pursued.

Applications and transcripts must be submitted by email no later than March 15, 2025. The FFBC Scholarship Awards Committee will notify recipients no later than April 15, 2025.

- 3. Tell a story about a chance you had to educate someone on LGBTQ+ issues in a one-on-one situation (coming out to them, countering a stereotype, confronting a bully, etc.).

### **SHORT-ANSWER QUESTIONS:**

Please limit all of your responses to a total of no more than 2 pages (8 1/2" x 11").

- What are your professional goals?
- What do you consider to be the most important issues facing the LGBTQ+ community today?
   Why?
- How will you continue activities directed toward this issue? Explain.
- How did you find out about the First Friday Breakfast Club Scholarship?
- Have you ever been arrested or charged with anything other than minor traffic offenses? Explain.




### Who We Are
