Earning points for MV were Kyle Engelken (144) with a 17-2 tech fall, Kipton Thompson (150) with a 16-1 tech fall, Clayton Davis (175) with a fall at :43, Nathan Beitz (215) with a fall at :42 and forfeit wins for Brayden Schuster (157), Braden Ronnebaum (190) and Chase Krogmann (285).

MV also defeated Springville, 42-3. Engelken won by fall in :34, Davis won by fall at 1:34, and Krogmann won by fall in :37. Thompson, Ronnebaum and Beitz earned forfeit points.

North Linn bested MV 62-18. MV's points all came from falls: Davis at :32, Beitz at :35 and Krogmann at 1:02.

This past Saturday, MV hosted its annual Farr Jebens Invitational. MV finished fifth out of 10 teams with 100 points. Burlington Notre Dame won with 293 points.

"We knew going into this game it was going to be tough," commented Coach Moenck. "Bellevue Marquette is a very good team and it's one of the toughest places to play in the whole league. I am so proud of our kids with the way they battled. We have some girls who are sick and banged up, but they really toughed this game out. We didn't shoot particularly well and we turned the ball over more than I liked, but we continue to play hard and play great defense which will give us a chance to win every night out. We have put ourselves in a nice spot and can still improve and grow as a team. That is exciting!"


